# **Sports News and Results**

#### Football

On Wednesday afternoon our Year 7/8's welcomed Battle Abbey for a football match. The match began extremely tight, with both teams struggling to find their passing rhythm in the opening stages. We took the lead through Marcus, whose shot just managed to beat the keeper and roll into the back of the net. We continued to press, winning the ball back effectively and breaking on Battle Abbey with powerful sprints down both wings from Misha and Marcus. This led to us winning a corner, to which Misha brilliantly connected with Luca's cross and diverted his effort powerfully passed the keeper to give us a 2-0 half time lead. Battle Abbey collected their thoughts at the break and came out on the attack from the start of the second half, and despite the best efforts of the defence we slipped to 3-2 down. It would have been 4-2 if it wasn't for an exceptional save from our stand in goalkeeper Ed Glasspool. We won a corner with merely seconds left on the clock and after a brilliant cross from Luca, a Battle Abbey player inadvertently diverted the ball into his own net. The match finished 3-3, which on the balance of play was a fair result. Well done to the boys for their efforts in tough conditions on Wednesday afternoon.

#### Hockey

Our Under 13's played a 7 a-side mini tournament against Battle Abbey and St Ronans on Wednesday. On our arrival, it was straight into our first match against St Ronans A team. We made an extremely positive start with Millie taking the ball down the wing and into the D and narrowly missing an early goal. After that the game was very evenly balanced. Edie and Evie made some vital tackles in defence and Emma ably steered the mid field, moving the ball up the pitch. Unfortunately, in over-time, St Ronans sneaked a goal in to give them a 1 - 0 victory. Undeterred, we went straight into our second game against St Ronans' B team. We showed increasing confidence both in attack

and defence and before long Aoife opened the scoring from a great pass from Eva. Emma scored a convincing goal during the second half to give a thoroughly well-deserved 2-0 victory. Again, it was straight into our third and final game against Battle Abbey who scored an early goal and despite some excellent attacks, we were denied an equaliser by some competent saves by the opposition keeper. The final score was 1-0 which saw us take joint second over-all. Well done to the squad, a very encouraging start to the hockey season.
