Rounders

The U10 girls had a very exciting game against SH Wadhurst. The first innings was very close, finishing 4-4½. We executed a good number of strong hits into the deep field area and were successful at getting players out, when fielding. The second innings was just as close and it all came down to SH's last five balls. The second innings finished 4½ to 5½ giving a final score of 9-9½. Well done to all the girls.

Our U11's played a promising game against SH Wadhurst. We elected to field first and Saira successfully stumped a player out at first post off an accurate throw from Diana to give us an encouraging start. This was followed up by Melissa getting a further two players out at second. Unfortunately, our opponents had a number of strong hitters who were able to expose gaps in our fielding to give them a first innings total of 11. Our batting started hesitantly, but before long Mireya and Louise found form scoring some super rounders to help give us a first innings total of 7 and keep our opponents within sight. Frustratingly, our opponents were on top form in their second innings, taking chances and putting our fielders under significant pressure. Jemima took a super catch at third deep and Melissa stayed calm at second and got three more players out. SHW ended with a total of 26 rounders, it was going to be a challenging second innings. The whole team rallied together, chipping away at the score line, but the gap remained, sadly out of our reach. The final score was $26 - 15 \frac{1}{2}$ to our opponents.

On Thursday our U14 team had a home match against Radnor House. It was our first match of the summer term and having won the toss we opted to field first. Some silly fielding errors let Radnor keep adding up their score but we found our rhythm towards the second half and some lovely work from Millie as backstop and Zoe on first saw us get three players our in quick succession. We managed to keep their score to 7½ rounders. We went into bat with some lovely tactical play and great hitting giving our first innings a tally of 9. Radnor had regrouped in the break and also worked more tactically in the second innings. They produced some lovely batting but through some good fielding and team work we kept their second innings tally at 8. Chasing a score of 151/2 we went into bat for the final time. We started slowly and missed some half rounder opportunities. However we kept our cool and despite some good fielding by Radnor we managed to finish the match with a score of 18 rounders and a great victory. Well done.
