Rounders

On a dreary Tuesday our U15 team went to Benenden to play rounders. We fielded first and were quite sluggish to start. However we did get better with Ingie commanding the quadrant, Hope playing a sharp backstop and Izzy successfully getting players out at first. Kendra also displayed some excellent fielding techniques and Jenny caught a player out at first. Our batting started tentatively and the rain began to fall which made running for posts tricky. Whole rounders were scored by Hope (2) Ingie and Izzy. We tried to chase down the oppositions score of 11 but with conditions against us we managed $8\frac{1}{2}$ rounders. We hoped to bring back the deficit in the second innings but sadly the conditions were too dangerous.

The U14's played their first game against Benenden and were put into bat first. Lucy got off to a good start with a great hit off a no-ball to open the scoring. Flossie, Gratsiella and Coral-Anne followed on to give us a total of 3½ off the first nine balls. We increased in confidence and ended the innings with 15½ rounders. A combination of Nell's steady bowling and precise work out in the field resulted in our opponents struggling to open their scoring and we successfully got three players out off their second hits, restricting them to 8 rounders. A tremendous victory to start the summer season.

Cricket

On Thursday the U15 cricket team travelled to Radnor House, unfortunately due to injuries Radnor could not put out a full team so the players made up two mixed teams. It was an enjoyable learning experience for all with marked improvements in batting and bowling techniques from all students.

Tag Rugby

On Wednesday afternoon, we took twenty pupils from Years 5 & 6 forming two teams, to compete in the annual Tag Rugby Festival. The non-competitive format of the competition meant that this year's tournament was different from other years. Our 'Black' team competed against Bishop's Down, St Augustine's and Frant and with explosive running from Sam Collinson, excellent tagging and pin-point passing we came away with victories in all of these matches. Our 'Red' team faced opposition from Bishop's Down, Claremont and St Matthew's, managing to win two out of their three matches.

On Thursday our U13 & U15 girls played in the Tag Rugby Tournament. Our U13's did fantastically well sharing the top points in their group by the end of the competition. Zoe was our top try scorer with 4 tries followed by Abi with 3. Our U15's exceeded expectations. Our first match was a sharp learning curve narrowly losing to TOGS in the final seconds. It was an encouraging start highighted by Hope's impressive flying tackle causing a

turn over ball. The squad consisted of four Year 9 and five Year 10 girls. Our leading try scorer was Hannah Fryza with 5 tries. We found ourselves in the Shield Final narrowly missing out on the Cup Final by one point.
