Geography & History Trip

On Tuesday Year 7 students visited Tonbridge Castle for a cross-curricular field trip. The students carried out a range of activities including an environmental survey of the High Street, a pedestrian count and an analysis of the settlement of the Castle. They then enjoyed a highly informative tour of the castle gatehouse, where they learnt about the history and its famous occupants. The trip concluded with an hour in the education room where they played Medieval games, dressed up in costumes and attempted to make their own chainmail.

Sports News and Results

Netball
