Sixth Form Foundation Year

A tailor-made course to prepare you for your A-level studies, the main focus being on linguistic skills in English



Students can enter Beechwood Sixth Form with a basic level of English, normally a score of IELTS 5, and receive an intensive course of English lessons from qualified EAL teachers. Students would be expected to reach IELTS 6 before starting their A-level courses.

They can study a one-year IGCSE course in Mathematics, English and their native language, where appropriate. In addition, as their level of English improves, students may join A-level subject lessons, as appropriate, to increase their subject vocabulary.

They will learn about cultural differences and the expected behaviour in an English classroom, such as how to ask questions or ask for help, ensuring that they get the most out of their A-level lessons. Students will be taught in small groups by well-qualified staff, gradually mixing in academic classes with English native speakers.

Students quickly become absorbed into our multicultural boarding community in which around one-third of boarders are from the UK and the common language is English. Beechwood is noted for the excellent pastoral care of all its pupils, and its warm friendly atmosphere.

Beechwood offers a wide range of A-level courses and a comprehensive Sixth Form Enrichment programme, including specialist advice and support on application to Higher Education.
