The School

Beechwood Sacred Heart School is a forward thinking, inclusive and caring co-educational, independent, day, weekly and boarding school with 350 pupils on roll (between 3 years and 18 years). Beechwood is an international school and welcomes all faiths whilst being justifiably proud of its Catholic ethos. The pupil and staff body is diverse with many faiths forming our Community. The School prides itself on the close relationship between staff and pupils, which flourishes in a family-like atmosphere

Its tradition of 'bringing out the very best' in each and every pupil, setting standards in all round achievement and genuinely being a 'happy place to be' has endured and ensured generational support. Beechwood became co-educational in 2008 and now provides an outstanding education for boys and girls, both boarding and day. With its integral preparatory school, it provides continuous education for the whole age range from 3 to 18 years with pupils joining the senior school at age 11. Our boarding community is 70 strong and draws pupils from 14 different nationalities.

Under the direction of Beechwood's Head, Mrs Helen Rowe, there is an ambitious Development Plan driving the School forward. Outstanding teaching and learning, major capital development projects, together with a keen eye on the continual attention and improvement of those essential elements that makes Beechwood unique and successful, are at the heart of the Plan.

- be passionate about their subject
- be a team player contributing to the work of the School
- have evidence of a commitment to CPD
- have personal integrity and the drive to do what is best for the pupils
- have knowledge of current educational issues
- have good ICT skills
- demonstrate a high degree of emotional intelligence
- report to the Head of Science

Job Description - Teaching

- Producing effective and enjoyable lessons which promote understanding and problem-solving skills
- Showing excellent subject expertise and maintaining knowledge of A level specifications
- Giving sufficient individual attention to ensure that each pupil is achieving his/her full potential
- Liaising with Special Needs Department / EAL for pupils needing additional input
- Using effective assessment techniques which allow you to have a full understanding of each pupil's attainment and progress
- Delivery of subject lessons that meet or exceeds the teaching standards.
- Using assessment data, including CAT4, ALIS, exam board ERA, GCE and GCSE indicators to help planning for the future and to gauge present performance and target underperformance.
- Communicating with parents and Heads of Division (pastoral) as appropriate
- Keeping complete and accurate records of attainment and progress
- Completing grades and written reports as requested
- Develop and integrate the use of ICT where appropriate in the subject.
- Keeping abreast of academic development, teaching and learning techniques in your subject area. The school focuses upon cognitive strategies in education and these will be adopted and integrated into the teaching and learning in order to encourage independence, flexibility and creativity.
