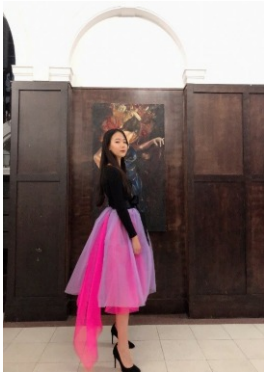

## Netball
